Stamping Imperfection Calendar Easel Tutorial



It's always fun to have little gifts to share with special people during the holidays. This calendar easel is a great gift to create for those special people.

SUPPLIES

CARD STOCK:

Mossy Meadow (133676): 8 1/2" x 4 1/4" for base; 3 1/2" x 2 5/8" for calendar matte (this size will be determined by the calendar size)

Old Olive (100702): 4" x 2"; 4" x 1 5/8"; 4" x 1"; 3 1/4" x 2 3/8" for calendar matte (this size will be determined by the calendar size)

Color Me Autumn designer series paper (135820): 3 3/4" x 3/4"; 1 5/8" x 3 3/4"

Simply Scored Scoring Tool (122334)

Old Olive 1/8" Taffeta Ribbon (119256)

Candy Dots Brad Bases (132293)

Candy Dots, Brights (130931)

1/16" circle punch (134363)

Calendars - not Stampin' Up! or use the attached calendar template

INSTRUCTIONS :

1. Using the Simply Scored Scoring Tool, place the 8 1/2" edge of the large Mossy Meadow piece on top and score at 2 1/8" and 4 1/4". Fold lines so that base is folded in half and also creates a tent-like shape.
2. Tie a piece of Old Olive ribbon around the 4" x 2" Old Olive card stock piece. Attach this piece to the top section (outside) of the scored Mossy Meadow piece.
3. Attach the 3 3/4" x 1 5/8" piece of designer paper to the 4" x 1 5/8" piece of Old Olive card stock, then attach to the bottom section (outside) of the scored Mossy Meadow piece.
4. Attach the 3 3/4" x 3/4" piece of designer paper to the 4" x 1" piece of Old Olive card stock. Use the 1/16" circle punch to put a hole in the upper left corner of the piece. Insert the brad base through the hole, and then attach this piece to the lower part of the "inside" of the Mossy Meadow card stock piece. The brad will act as the "stop" for the calendar easel, so place it accordingly. Put the Old Olive candy brad onto the brad base.
5. Attach the remaining two card stock piece together and then place onto the bottom half of the easel base (the piece from step three). The top half of this piece will be unattached so that it can stick up when the easel is folded out. Attach the calendar.
6. Your calendar easel is done!
